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The defining event in West End history - In May 1892 the Zinzendorf Hotel opened on property currently used by Kilpatrick Stockton for its law offices. The hotel was built at the western end of town adjacent to a lush forest, and was to serve as a spa and hunting lodge for the region's well-to-do. Rooms were \$3-\$5 a day! Many towns a century ago had a fashionable "West End": thanks to prevailing winds, that was the side of town not subject to the foul smells and grit of industrial smokestacks. Within a few months, the structure burned to the ground in a Thanksgiving Day fire, and the land was opened to subdivision and development as a residential area. The hotel was named for Count Zinzendorf, who two centuries earlier had given Moravians refuge.
