In our West End neighborhood forty-odd species of birds are commonly heard and seen. This number seems surprising until we think of the categories: finches, thrushes, woodpeckers, birds of the high tree canopies, various blackbirds and swallows. I have loved and gotten to know these birds since we bought our house here in 1965, and I would like to tell you a little about them. First, the Carolina wren, "thryothorus ludovicianus," one of the most charming songsters, lives here yearround. The clear ringing tones of its many songs are like no other bird. In common with all wrens, it has a lovely musical voice. One three part callis "sugar-BEET, sugar-BEET," or if you prefer, "trick-or-TREAT, trick-or-TREAT," It has other calls and notes, all characterized by a striking, ringing clarity of tone. It is colored a warm chestnut brown, with a prominent white eye-stripe and a white throat. The chest is a golden tan. In common with all wrens, it often cocks its speckled brown tail over its back. The body is a stubby 5 ¾ inches long. The Carolina wren raises 2 or 3 broods a year, and will nest in the most unusual places: old tires, mailboxes, air conditioners, car bumpers, and even old hats. Our other neighborhood wren "troglodytes aedon," commonly known as the house wren, or jenny wren, has similar nesting habits. Though a mere 4 ½ inches, this little wren is fearless, and will boldly scold anything or anyone who encroaches. We have all heard these fierce, irritated scolding notes at one time or another. As a contrast, the song is a jubilant burst rising up, then dropping in a musical cascade. The song is different from the Carolina wren in that we don't hear single notes; rather, bubbling cascades. Mousy gray-brown in color, we are more likely to hear the house wren before seeing it, then to observe its energetic flitting, and see the diagnostic cocking-up of its stubby tail. Both wrens enjoy eating insects, and both remain here year-round. Dear friends: you can probably tell the above descriptions are written by a musician.

Winston-Salem Community Appearance Awards

Kudos to Sam Ogburn Jr. for winning an award for his renovations of the duplexes at 1105-1107 and 1109-1111 West End Blvd. The West End Association nominated Ogburn, Jr. based upon the dramatic improvements he made in bringing these two structures into line with the predominant character of the neighborhood.

Guest speaker for the 2003 Community Appearance Awards. Rick Roti, delivered an informative presentation on the benefits of the urban tree canopy. Roti is a lawyer and Chairman of the Tree Commission for Mecklenburg County. Recently he participated in writing Charlotte's first residential tree ordinance.

Trees provide a number of benefits to homeowners and communities including reductions of stormwater run-off, pollution, energy use, ozone production and habitat degradation. Trees also assist in re-charging groundwater and increasing property values. Roti presented dramatic evidence concerning the impact of tree canopy. As urban tree canopy is reduced, the loss of its cooling effects results in heat islands. Between 1972 and 1993 the summers in Atlanta became 12 degrees hotter due to a comparable percentage decrease in the tree canopy.

While the West End is particularly blessed with a beautiful tree canopy, it is threatened when aging trees are not replaced, and by urban development pressures that exacerbate disease and pests. A canopy analysis would be a good starting point if we wish to prevent huge losses in the future.


