# 2006 begins with much activity -Join us at the Annual Meeting on February 7

**The West End** Association opened its meeting on January 3, 2006 at 7pm at Tise House. Committee Reports, Historic Resource Commission and Neighborhood Improvement-Jack Smith: Jack mentioned that the HRC meeting would be held on January 4<sup>th</sup>. Updates will be given at the February Association meeting. Ad hoc Public Safety-Rick Pender: The Western Downtown Initiative will reconvene on January 23. Agenda topics will include chronic homelessness and offending. Improvements have been made on Burke Street in relation to noise, panhandling and littering. The Winston-Salem Police Department and the Burke Street merchants have been working together to address crime and other quality of life issues that impact Burke Street and West End. Social and Holiday-Maria McGee: Maria and other judges walked the West End neighborhood during the holidays and selected houses that exemplified the joy and celebration of the holiday season. House decorations were judged in two categories: traditional appearance and festive light. The winners were 810 West End Boulevard for traditional appearance and 1406 Jarvis Street for festive light. 1224 Glade Street was recognized as an honorable mention for its good taste in decorations.

Old Business. The CHANGE presentation was postponed due to illness. Crime Report -Lt Bill Cobb: Breaking and Enterings continue throughout the city with 61 people being arrested for 81 incidents. Lt Cobb requests that citizens stay alert and keep an eye on their neighbors' houses. An easy way to become a victim of auto theft is to leave a running car unattended. The number of automobile thefts increases in the winter months due to cars being left on the street unoccupied with the engines running.

New Business. Holiday Homes Tour, December 2006: Stephanie Abnon has volunteered to co-chair the Homes Tour. In addition to needing another co-chair, the Association is now in the process of soliciting houses to be on the Tour. New Year's Resolutions for 2006: The floor was opened up for ideas and projects for the Association in 2006. They were as follows: Association to be better connected with other civic/service projects that are underway in the city; utilize West End cash reserves for social capital projects; better use of the newsletter to solicit plans or objectives for West End; financial and in-kind support for River Run film festival; Deer hunt for 2006; Easter egg rolls in Grace Court; trash cans placed on First Street between the Hawthorne and Burke Street boundaries; adopt-a-street for trash pickup; beautification projects for West End intersections; Daniel Boone monument project.


